That opened for the world's new Day.

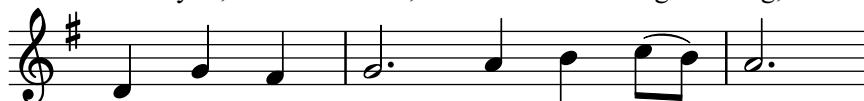

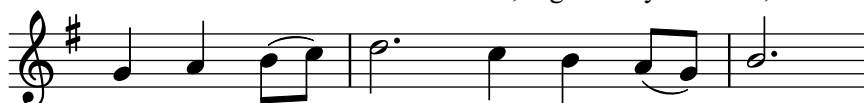
